


Diamond Drill

Out of the Past

Members of the Crystal Falls High School debate teams, arguing both sides of whether or not the United Nations should be significantly strengthened, came away from the annual Upper Peninsula debate meet at Marquette with top honors in Class B. Senior Kenneth Swan and sophomore Howard Tonkin presented the case in favor of the United Nations strength captured the Class B debate title. Seniors Bill Tonkin and Jack Jarp arguing the negative side won all three debates. The U.P. victory is the third win by a Crystal Falls team in the last six years. Crystal Falls was one of the eight class B schools (400 enrollment or less) which were entered in the tournament. Other members of the Crystal Falls team included James Blacyki, Dennis McCowen and Carole Schultz that was coached by Mrs. Evelyn VonZellen.

In a year-end report, Michigan DNR fish supervisor Florin Warren, stated that 67,050 trout and 50 northern pike were planted in Iron County rivers, lakes and streams during 1960. In weight the plantings amounted to just over 5 tons with most of the fish planted over legal size.
