

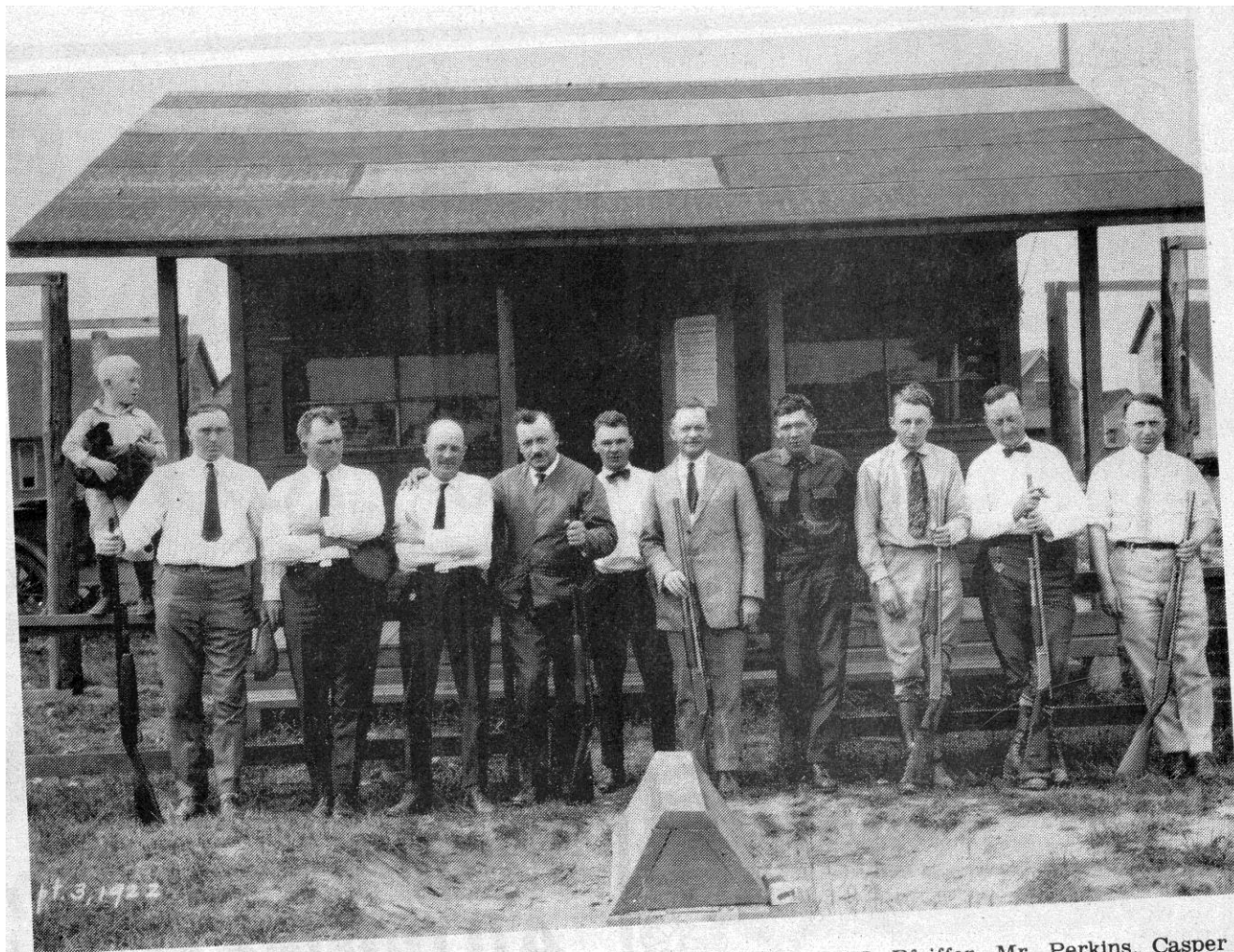
Diamond Drill

Out of the Past

May 7, 1926

Through the good offices of the McKinney Steel Company in giving to the people the use of a field at the Great Western, located on the fenced in grounds of the former old race track north of the Cemetery, Crystal Falls has a golf course. It is not one of the expensive, high class course but a seven hole lay-out featuring sand "greens". Mike Shields is in charge of the harrowing, dragging and rolling the fairways. The former Crystal Falls Gun Club quarters will be secured to serve as the rest house and caddy-master stand. If the demand is great enough future plans include adding an additional two holes and constructing more expensive greens.

Mansfield Township showed that it appreciates the advantage of having the Crystal Falls Cemetery at its disposal for the burial of its dead by volunteering to contribute \$300 per year towards its upkeep. Discussions are also on going between Mansfield Township and Crystal Falls City officials in regard to possible fire protection.
