Altman (34), a meat cutter by trade, along with his wife Mary Jane have four children, David (12), Annette (9), Donald (6) and Darryl (2) who have already enrolled in the Crystal Falls Schools. The six-unit motel, located at 1309 Hwy US-2 just west of the Crystal Falls City limits, was constructed and opened in June 1954 by Robert Miller, sold to Edward Taylor in April 1955 and purchased by the Brauer's in January 1957.

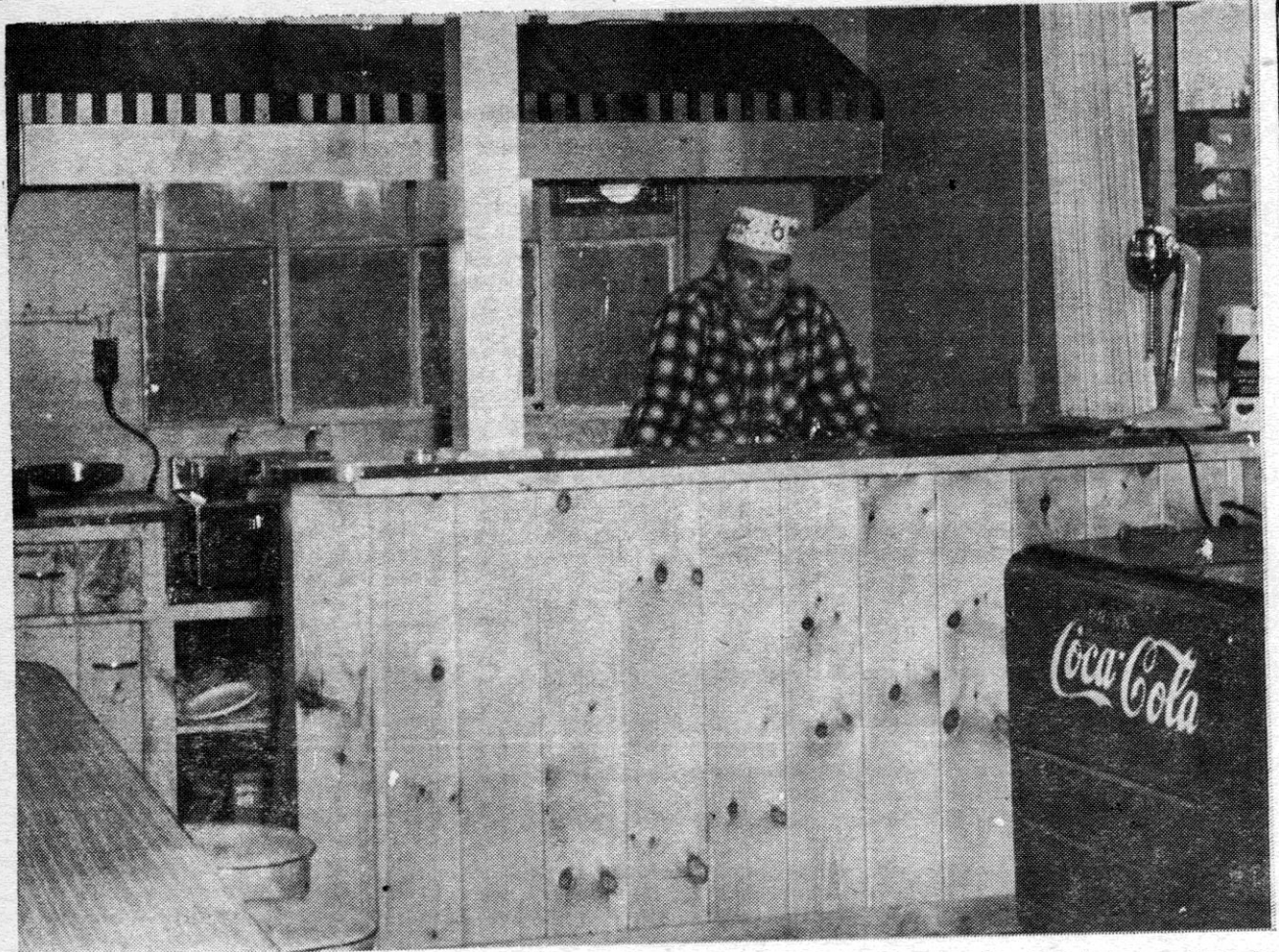
