Out of the Past

Seventeen new members were inducted into the Crystal Falls High School chapter of the National Honor Society. The candidates were selected by the High School faculty on the basis of their scholarship, character, leadership abilities and service to their school and classmates. Michigan State Officials have published the total watercraft and vehicle registrations for the year 1960. Watercraft registrations totaled 348,968 for the entire State with 1,848 of that total from Iron County. Iron County had 9,320 vehicles registered for 1960 up from 9,145 registered in 1959. The Michigan State Conservation Department also reported that 3,150 whitetails were killed by automobiles on the State highways. Of this total 760 deer were killed on Upper Peninsula roadways, the lowest figure on record for this part of the State.
