Crystal Falls is to have a more rigid inspection of its milk and meat than has been the case in the past. Upon the recommendation of Dr. C.F. Larson, Health Officer, Dr. George Nordstrom, Crystal Falls Veterinarian, was appointed milk and meat inspector. Milk peddlers and meat sellers will have to get a license to sell their products in the City of Crystal Falls and all cattle must be inspected for tuberculosis prior to selling to the public. Dr. Larson hopes that the new rules will prevent what in the past were persons who were butchering and selling old cows indiscriminately without testing for diseases.

The hotel in Amasa owned by the Pickens-Mather Iron Company and operated for the past year by Bert Stebbins and family has closed. The hotel has been a great convenience to Amasa and its closing will be felt although the area. Amasa House owned and operated by William Hermanson will be able to take care of the transient trade while the mines are closed.
