The Rezin's Drug Store sign (300 Superior) that has been a main street landmark for many years was removed in the interest of safety. Rust and corrosion had weakened the supporting structure to an extent that it could have collapsed at any time. The sign was originally erected at the former location of the Rezin Drug Store (316 Superior) in 1935 and then moved to its present location in 1959. The Rezin Drug Store originally opened in 1906 in the Masonic/Scadden Building (301 Superior) in 1906 and after a fire on December 17, 1934 destroyed the building moved to 316 Superior 1935 and closed the present location in 1974.

There has been a boom in residential construction in the Great Western Location. Many fine homes are being built with some having a spectacular view of the Paint River Valley. They include Dale Peters (208 Lincoln), Dave Seppala (225 Lincoln), Robert Gussert (407 Wagner) and Ernie Werth (211 Garfield).
