The Robinson Law went into effect and states that no person shall employ a girl or woman as bartenders or to serve liquors or furnish music or dancing in any saloon where spirituous or intoxicating liquors are sold.

A new law passed requires that a complete registration of all deaths including a death certificate and the issuing of a burial permit by the local government officials before internment can take place.

The new law compelling the owners of mining property to put fences around their open pits went into effect. It will be the duty of the mine inspector in each county to notify the mine owners to enclose all abandoned pits which he considers dangerous. If the owners do not comply with the order in the allowed time the mine inspector will have it done and the expense of the work will be charged against the property.
