Out of the Past

Demonstrating clearly that the law plays no favorites in regards to enforcing the Crystal Falls City municipal parking ordinance, City Police ticketed motor vehicles belonging to three prominent townspeople. Police Chief, Frank Carlson wrote his first ticket to Mayor Ludwig Stoor, whose Dodge truck was parked in front of his business (325 Superior). Minutes later cars belonging to Edward Burling, Crystal Falls City Treasurer and L.A. Henry (308 Superior) were ticketed and the owners assessed \$1 fines. City Police are strictly enforcing the parking ordinance which limits parking to two hours on Superior Avenue and the side streets to the alleys immediately parallel to Superior Avenue and directly behind the main street businesses.

Novenio Pivatto, well known Crystal Falls businessman has purchased the building and tavern business of Mr. and Mrs. Dominic Selmo (234 Superior). The location has long been a prominent business address with Nick LaChapelle first erecting his restaurant on the site in 1886, Flood's Confections and Recreation Center opened in 1901 with the Selmo's purchasing the property in 1933.
