The exhibit at the Crystal Falls School (211 S. Fourth) was opened last night with a crowd of people filling the High School Room to its limits. The exhibit is probably as complete and beautiful an array of the work of the pupils and teachers as any school ever displayed to an appreciative crowd. The walls are covered with specimens of various sorts, while an improvised screen, eight feet in height, extending lengthwise of the room being used on both sides. Most of the work is made up in the form of neatly bound booklets presenting many specimens of art of original design embellished with drawings in crayon, pencil and pen and ink. The festooning of paper chains lends a gala appearance to the ceiling. It is indeed a display that will interest the old as well as the young affording hours of solid mental refreshment to anyone who will take the trouble to visit. It will live as a monument for all to their skill and be a testament of the excellence of the Crystal Falls School.
