Extract of the new Michigan Game Laws for 1896: Deer may be killed from the 1st day of November to the 25th of November each year in both peninsulas. Deer must not be killed or captured in the water or by use of a dog; any dog following a deer, or even a deer track, may be lawfully killed by any person when so seen and the dog owner has no recourse; not more than five deer may be killed in any one year; any deer or part of a deer shipped shall have a coupon attached signed by the license owner in the presence of the shipping agent at point of shipment; License fee for residents (six months) 50 cents, non-resident fee \$25.
