Intrigue highlighted the annual rabbit hunt held at the Bicigo Liver Lake complex as to the awarding of the "12th District Mafia Master Hunter Award". Originally awarded to "Bunzo" Dalpra but a dispute as to how he obtained his harvest was "discussed" in a Toscano cigar smoke filled Cabin #3 where the "Dago Red" flowed freely which may never be fully resolved, resulted in Norb Dishaw actually taking the trophy home. The rabbit hunt has a long and colorful history. First began in December 1931 by a group of sportsmen who ventured to the newly constructed Bicigo Camp, then located on the former Eli Silverman property North of Deerskin Lake (T44N/R31W Sec 30, W1/2 of NW1/4). With the building of the Way Dam in 1940 and subsequent creation of the Michigamme Backwaters, the modern era hunt reemerged in January 1964 at the Alvin Richards Camp (T44N/R32W Sec11, NE1/4 of SW1/4) jointly owned with Ozzie Casanova and Attilio Tirapelli. In February 1965 the assembly of indoor and outdoor "sportsmen" moved to the Bicigo Liver Lake property.

MANY ATTEND HUNT




