Out of the Past

April 28, 1949

Iron County residents will turn their clocks ahead one hour for daylight savings time on Monday Morning and will remain in effect until Sunday September 25th. The Iron County Board of Supervisors had originally voted (11-6) in early April not to observe daylight savings time. After a petition drive, which gathered thousands of signatures, the municipalities of Caspian, Crystal Falls, Gaastra, Iron River and Stambaugh voted to overturn the County's decision and adopt the advancing of the clocks one hour.

The Crystal Falls Schools Board of Education has approved a \$166,169 budget for the upcoming 1949-50 school year. The department of instruction will receive \$105,791 an increase of \$9,007 from this year. Principal and teacher salaries amount for \$91,826 of this total.

Regular weekly garbage collection within the city limits of Crystal Falls will resume this week. Each winter the garbage collection is suspended when city crews are busy with snow removal. The collection will be made by City trucks on Monday and Tuesday of each week. Garbage cans must be galvanized iron, approximately 27 inches in height and 14 inches in diameter with tightly fitting lids with all perishable garbage wrapped.
