Out of the Past

November 4, 1948

Following in line with action taken at recent meetings of west side communities, the Crystal Falls City Commission unanimously approved return to Central Standard Time effective this weekend. All clocks in Iron County will be turned back one hour at 12:01 AM Sunday November 7th. The clocks in the County have remained one hour "fast" as a result of a special plea entered by the City of Crystal Falls to relieve an acute power shortage. City Manager W.F. Jacka stated "It has cut down the consumer demand for electricity during the evening meal and as a result we have been better able to meet our demand satisfactorily".

Iron County Residents joined the nation in accepting what election officials are terming the biggest upset in the history of the country with the election of Democrat Presidential candidate Harry S. Truman's victory over the heavily favored Republican Thomas E. Dewey. In the most eagerly watched Iron County race, incumbent Democrat Sherriff Emery J. King defeated Republican Iron River Police Chief Edward P. Sandri (4,366 – 3,726).
