



Out of the Past

All that remains of the 1931 Iron County Medicare building constructed in 1930 is a pile of rubble and that is being rapidly eliminated. There have been many spectators to the destruction of one of the most structurally sound buildings in the County, deemed unsuitable by the Health Department and Fire Marshall's Office. A new administration wing will be added as part of the comprehensive remodeling and rebuilding project that will begin shortly. The facility dating back to the 1890's was originally called the "Iron County Poor Farm" changed to the Iron County Hospital in 1907 then to the Iron County Infirmary before assuming its present name as the Iron County Medicare.
