Crystal Falls High School principal Harry Trainor, says that one of the past dangers relating to High School athletes was the possibility of becoming a "professional" where the player receives pay and thus losing their armature eligibility to participate in school sports. According to Section 7 of the State Association rules a player may not play on a professional team nor receive money without incurring School ineligibility.
