Out of the Past

The Crystal Falls city owned Runkle Lake campground rates have been slightly modified for the upcoming season. The trailer rate of \$1 per day for both local and non-resident users will remain the same as last year. The local resident fee of 50 cents per day for tent campers has been eliminated. The levy covers the expense of water and electricity supplied.

The new memorial dedicated to the war dead of two world wars and the Korean conflict will be on display for the first time at the VFW Post Headquarters (108 Superior) on Memorial Day. The memorial, which is craved from bronze granite, measures 3.5' wide X 2.5' high X 6" thick contains the inscription "In Memory of those who served"; "Tufts-Rondon Post No. 2891, VFW".

A new traffic control plan has been approved by Crystal Falls City Commission. The plan brought forth by police chief Charles Setagord would eliminate over 40 stop signs at traffic crossings throughout the City. Generally the bulk of the full stop signs now in use are in residential districts. In their place new signs will be installed warning motorists to "Yield Right of Way".
