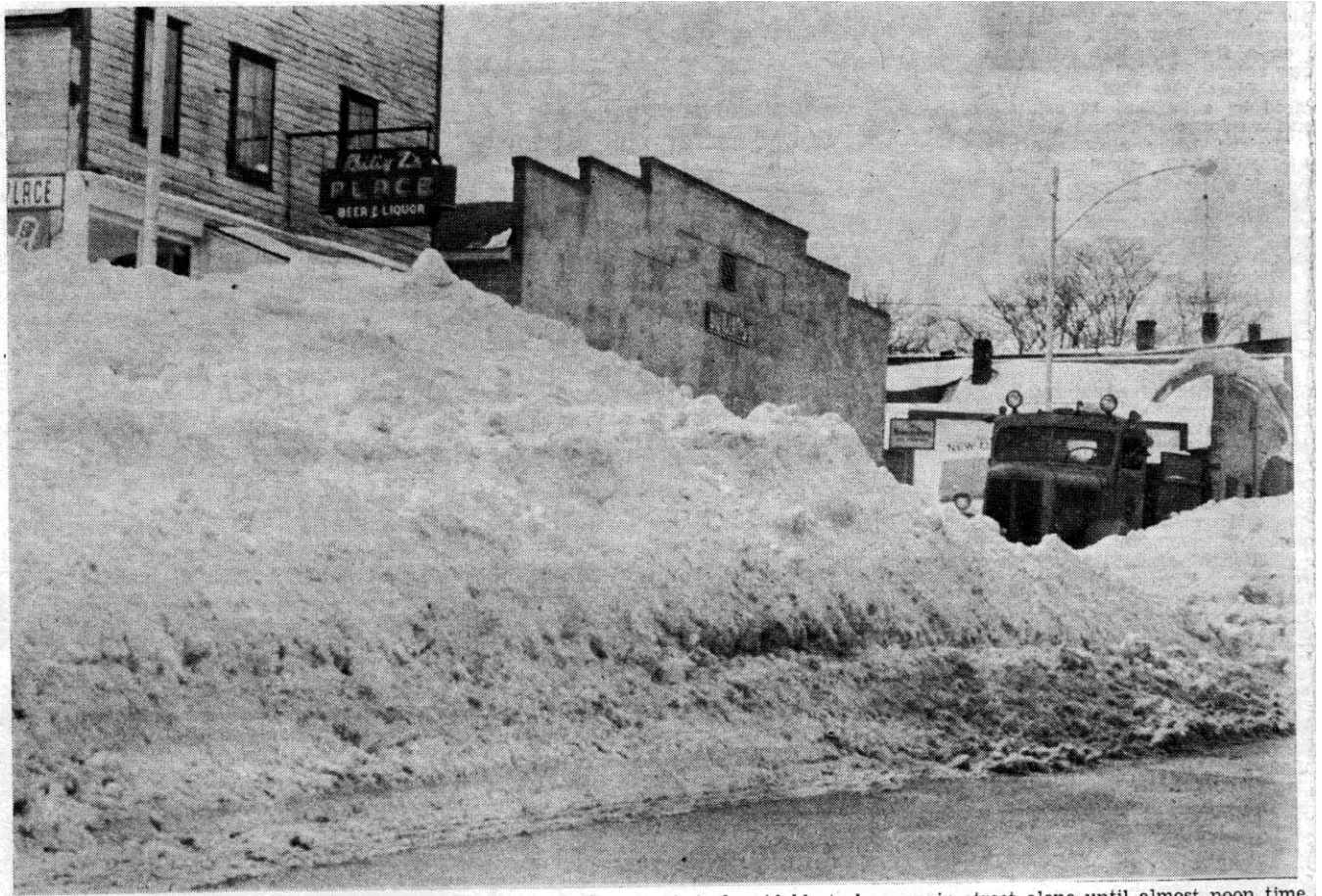
Out of the Past

March 16, 1961

Digging out from another one of winter's weekend storms occupied the Crystal Falls City Street Department. Old man winter in an ugly mood dropped over 18" of fresh snow on the area. Using their large front end loader mounted snow blower attachment it took a fleet of six trucks, some of them hired for the purpose, over two days to haul away the accumulated snow banks from the center of Superior Avenue.

Lou Hagglund, rolling in the Tuesday night's Women's Sport League at the Martinson Bowling Alley (105 Superior), set a new record in the category of individual high game with a blistering 254, among the highest total ever recorded by a woman kegger on the Martinson Lanes. The big tally came on a combination of nine strikes, a split and a spare requiring only 13 tosses of the bowling ball.
