Out of the Past

August 25, 1960

A Holstein calf was born on January 15 at the Joe Wiencek farm located on Section 6 road South of Crystal Falls. The calf came into the world well equipped with two well-formed heads. Unfortunately the rigors of birth were too much and it was unable to stand and died shortly afterward. Eino Nelson, an amateur taxidermist from Memory Lane, has recently completed a mount preserving the rare animal for future display.

The Michigan Conservation Department is studying the possibility of sending "plain clothes" officers to accompany regular Conservation Law Enforcement officers during the busy fall deer hunting season. This auxiliary corps of law enforcement "deputies" would be composed of field men from all Department divisions.
