Out of the Past

November 6, 1897

Sunday night a couple of Amasa's citizens, who have managed to keep their identity well hidden, started out to create a little "excitement". That they succeeded in doing so is evidenced by the number of broken windows that now adorn the town. The fracas began when a fellow named Arvoid and a companion Benson threw the inside of Bloomquist's Saloon out through the front windows. After chasing the rock throwers they returned to the engine house to discover that the vandals had stopped the pump which feeds water to the boiler and also demolished the remainder of the windows in the building. Leaving the mine the troublemakers returned to town where they demolished the glass front of the W.J. Horder Store and the vacant building next door.
