Out of the Past

Approximately 600,000 red pine seedlings are being planted by the Michigan Conservation Department in Iron County south of Crystal Falls. The planting program is part of a 10-year plan which calls for planting some 20 million seedlings in State Forests annually. Locally, three planting machines are being employed on State owned land committing the sprouts to the soil at a rate of 15,000 per day. Six hundred acres, commonly known as the Panola Plains, are receiving an average of 1,000 trees, 12 inches in height per acre with an expected survival rate of 800 per acre to maturity in each 50 square feet.
