Crystal Falls resident Rudy Marketto has defended his Upper Peninsula Field Archery Association title when the 224 arrows left his bowstring for a score of 669 out of a possible 1,120 points. The result also earned him an Expert Class "A" designation. The competition consists of 28 targets with varying size bullseyes depending on distance with each archer shooting four arrows at each, either from one position or from four, with different distances ranging from five to 50 yards and different angles.
