Out of the Past

March 8, 1951

An estimated crowd of over 700 men, women and children overflowed the Crystal Falls City Hall auditorium Monday night for the annual Family Party Night sponsored by Malkin & Sons (11 Superior) Crystal Falls International Harvester Dealer. Built upon the precept that “everybody loves a party” the Malkin family night gatherings have steadily increased in popularity since they were started three years ago. The free stage and screen entertainment consisted of two color movies while the stage entertainment featured Carl Strong – cowboy with a “trained” lariat, Lew Brock – pantomime comedian, Jerry Ann – maid of magic, J. Michael – xylophonist, Eileen – lovely lady of the accordion and Joe Bonelli – the mad musician.

The popular Gay Gables Resort located on Stager Lake in Mastodon Township, closed since New Year’s Eve in compliance with the provision of its “resort liquor license” which only permits the sale of liquor from May 1st to January 1st, was reopened and now can operate in the future on a year-round basis. Dave Kennedy, proprietor of the resort, has been granted a permit by the Michigan Liquor Control Commission to operate his dance hall and bar for 12 months a year. Gay Gables was opened in 1937.
