Dan Kisner, one of the most noted airplane pilots, flew his airplane from Milwaukee to Amasa first landing in George Miskine's field where a large crowd gathered to view it before continuing on to the Triangle Ranch which was his original destination. The flight from Milwaukee was made in three and one-half hours. Kisner brought the plane to Iron County for the purpose of taking pictures of the Triangle Ranch from the air featuring points of interest. An aerial photographer, Albert E. Topler, came by rail and worked from the plane every day that the weather was clear enough to allow pictures to be taken. A total of 30 pictures were taken in all, the last one being from an elevation of 7,000 feet above the ground. It took the plane 40 minutes to attain that altitude.
