Nine year old Stockero took home top honors with a 63 point total earning him a prize of a box of chocolates donated by the host. The longest jump of the day was made by Dahl who set the hill record of 53 inches. As a footnote, the young Stockero had just returned from his victorious effort at the Hammerberg meet and while polishing his form on a small jump located at home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joe Stockero, 712 Wisconsin Avenue, crashed into a snow bank breaking his right leg below the knee.
