George E. Voss has been appointed to the position of Crystal Falls Postmaster. He was the only candidate for the office and replaces William J. Tally who has held the office since 1895. Voos becomes the seventh Postmaster since the Post Office was established in 1881. Julia E. Runkle (1881), Henry C. Kimball (1884), Arthur A. Metcalf (1886), Alonzo Parks (1889) and Solomon D. Hollister (1892).








