Out of the Past

June 5, 1897

Isaac Williams of Mansfield called on Undersheriff Tromblay Thursday evening to go to Mansfield and arrest his son, Richard, a young man who was intoxicated and disturbing the peace. Tromblay brought the younger Williams to town where he was held overnight in the Iron County Jail. In the morning the senior Williams came to town and paid a fine of \$15 for his son's release.

The weather threatened to interfere with the Decoration Day festivities but very kindly consented to a cessation of its disagreeableness until later in the day when a small sized blizzard with large snowflakes affected the area. The G.A.R and W.R.C together with the Crystal Falls Silver Coronet Band and entire school population formed a procession about three blocks in length and marched from the school house on South Fourth Street to the Opera House (28 Superior) where the indoor exercises were held. The Opera House was filled to its utmost capacity and many had to stand outside the doors.
