A population decline of 3,620 in Iron County's population since 1940 has been reported by the Michigan Department of Health. The 1947 population is estimated at 16,623 as compared to the 1940 total of 20,243. Similar losses are reported in most of the Upper Peninsula Counties with the 1947 U.P. population estimated at 292,123 versus 323,544 in 1940 a decline of 31,421. For the entire State of Michigan it is estimate that the population has grown from 5,258,106 in 1940 to 6,069,000 in 1947.
