Out of the Past

Quite an improvement was effected recently with the removal of the cage-like appearance at the upper section of wall at the First National Bank (305 Superior). The wall is separating the patron area from the enclosed employee division at the banking institution. The property has long been used as bank dating back to 1890 when the Iron County National Bank was organized and which was closed by the national bank holiday ordered by President Franklin D. Roosevelt on March 5, 1933 during the great depression. The First National Bank was founded at the location on October 1, 1934.

A \$100 fine with the alternative of a 20 day suspension of liquor vending has been imposed on the American Legion Louis Bowman Post #87 by the Michigan State Liquor Control Commission. The Post which operates a club in the lower level of the Crystal Inn (400 Superior) was charged with selling liquor to a non-member. The club has been licensed for four years and had no previous violations on its record.
