

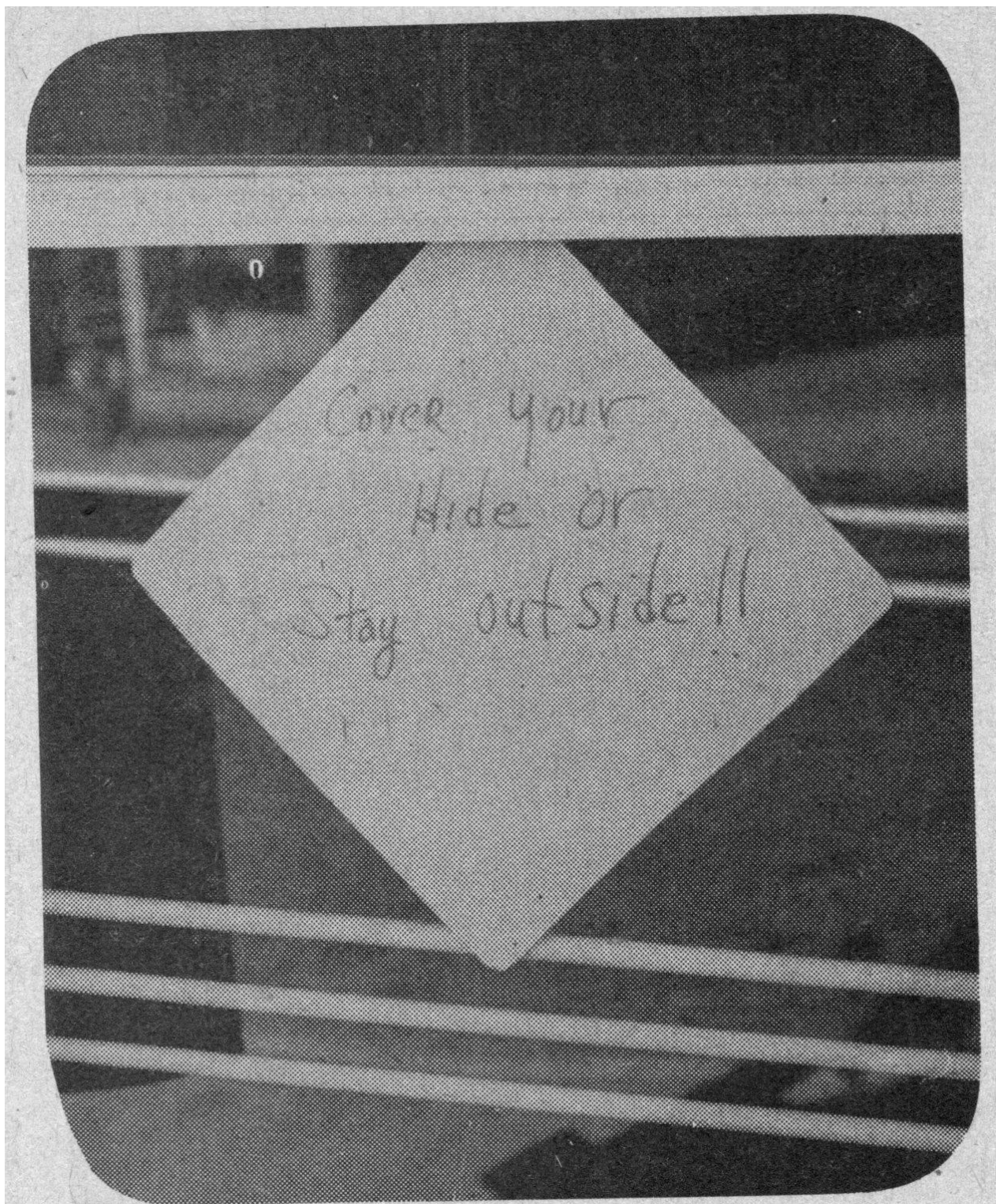

Out of the Past

According to the Michigan State Board of Education this fall approximately one-half of the 2.1 million students in Michigan Public Schools will ride school buses to and from classes every day. A total of 10,000 buses will travel a combined total of 100 million miles for the upcoming school year. Though not required to do so by State Law, every K-12 school district in the State provides some sort of bus transportation for their students. Michigan State guidelines state that to qualify for bus transportation the student has to live more 1 ½ miles from the school building. Elementary students can be expected to walk up to ½ mile to the nearest bus stop while high school students can be required to walk as far as 1 mile.
