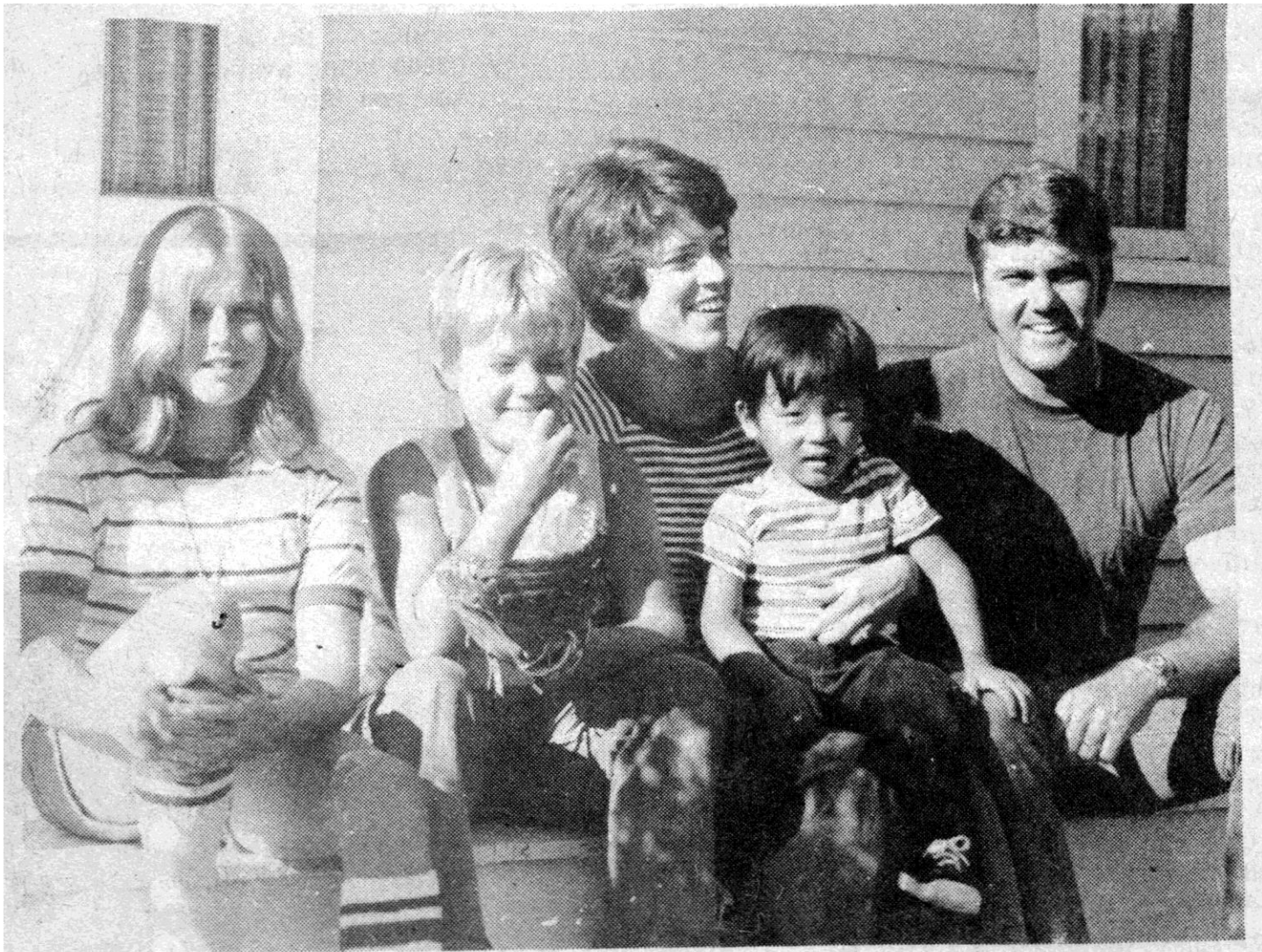


Diamond Drill
