The Michigan Supreme Court ruled that a person's "reputation" may be considered by officers contemplating an arrest for violation of the illegal liquor laws. The Court stated that an officer had the right to arrest a suspect without a warrant if he had "reasonable suspicion" that a violation may have occurred based on the suspects "reputation". While all men are created equal in the eyes of the law, the former life, conduct and reputation in the community of a person is a factor to him when arrested or tried for a criminal offense.

The teachers at the Tobin School, with the assistance of the Mothers Club, are feeding about 110 students hot meals at lunch. Many of the children come considerable distance and pack their own lunches and the hot meal is greatly appreciated.
