The Amasa couple charged with resisting Sate Games Wardens in the "Walloped The Wardens" incident had their day in court. The September incident revolved around the attempt by Wardens Lethin and Houlmont to retrieve a firearm that the couple's son had possessed which resulted into a free-for-all with the entire family participating in the "fun". Demanding a trial by jury the couple was represented by attorney Clarence Dwyer and the Wardens by Prosecutor Attorney Fred Murphy. Mr. Dwyer's defense centered on the fact the wardens failed to make an arrest thus the gun that the youth was carrying was not subject to seizure. The jury was out but a short time when they brought in the verdict of "Not Guilty".
